

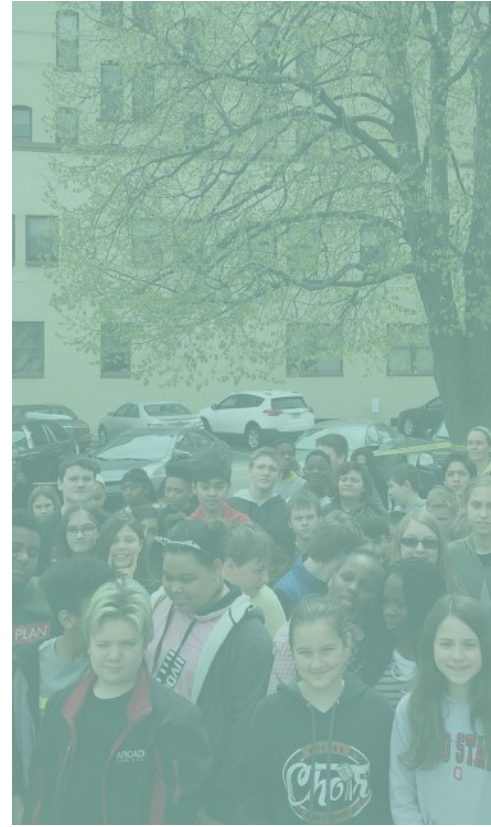

About Us

Since its inception in 2012, the Winona County Alliance for Substance Abuse Prevention (ASAP) coalition of community volunteers has taken a preventative approach to reduce and prevent youth substance use of alcohol, marijuana, and prescription drug use in the Winona Area Public Schools and Lewiston-Altura School Districts. In September of 2015, ASAP was awarded a 5-year federal grant of \$532,974 by the Drug-Free Communities (DFC) Support Program from the Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

Our Mission

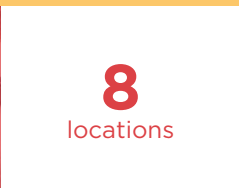
We work together to create a culture free from the misuse of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs for our youth through community-wide collaboration.
