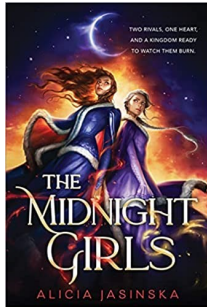


The Kindred

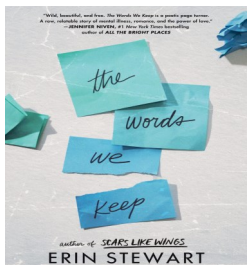

The Midnight Girls

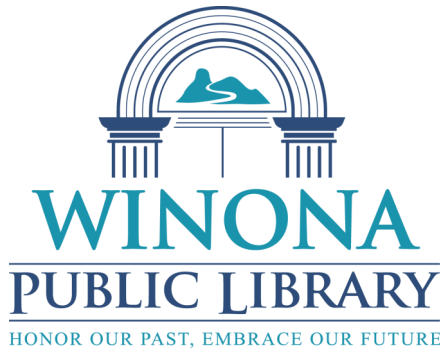

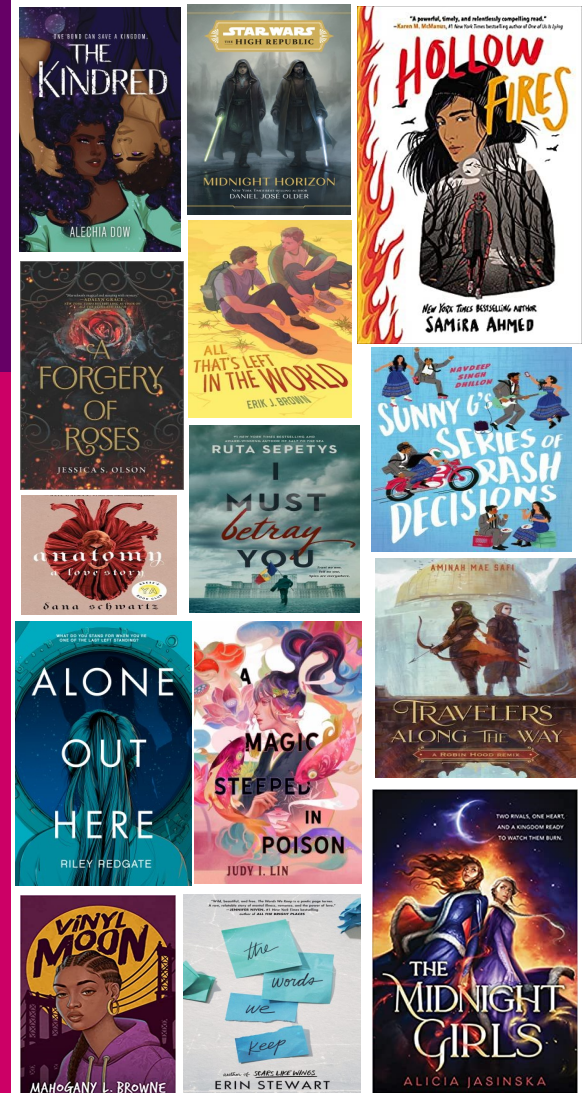

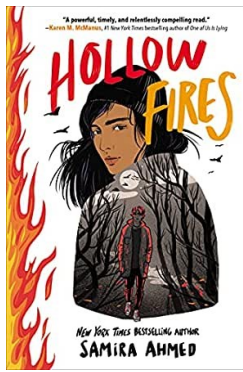

By Samira Ahmed

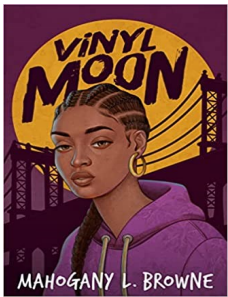

Confronting the anarchistic marauders known as the Nihil, the Jedi Knights and their Padawans are put to the test, but soon discover that nothing is what it seems.



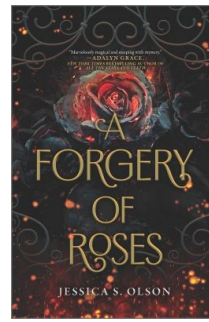
Alone Out Here By Riley Redgate

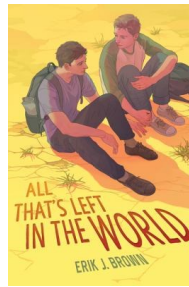

By Erik Brown

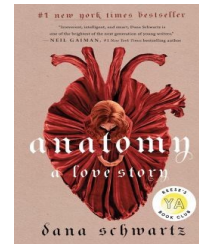
